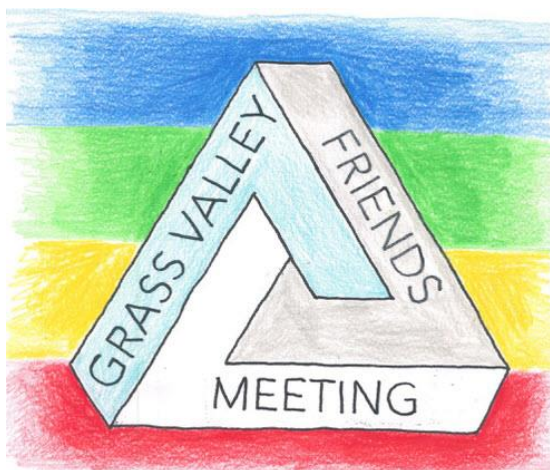

GVFM contributes! By Fosten Wilson

Since the April business meeting, there were many contributions to GVFM specifically to help the California Heritage: Indigenous Research Project/Nisenan (CHIRP) purchase of the Sierra Friends Center property. The Meeting check written in late April is for **\$6,000**. That is the \$500 approved in business meeting and the other \$5,500 that came by check & cash (so far?) Wow!

- All contributions from active members & attenders of GVFM (that I know of) total \$56,950 to this project!
- We are in good company. We scanned the list of donors on the CHIRP website, and I spotted 19 Quaker organizations nationwide that have donated something like \$38,000 overall.



PHASE TWO-UPDATE

CHIRP and the Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan Tribe would like to offer deep gratitude and thanks to our supporters, allies, and community who have come together within the span of less than 12 weeks to showcase

the collective power of individuals and community in uniting behind a meaningful cause. This remarkable achievement and ongoing support clearly illustrates our community's commitment to healing historical injustices, Indigenous land rematriation, and cultural revitalization.

Through the generous contributions of supporters worldwide, the total funds raised have passed the \$2 million mark!

With the incredible success of Phase 1 in raising the funds for the purchase price of Woolman, CHIRP is excited to continue the momentum into Phase 2, in which funds raised will ensure that the necessary improvements to the land and property infrastructure are in alignment with both the Tribe's needs and vision, as well as the health and stewardship of the land.

During the discovery period, the necessary updates identified for the road and building infrastructure, septic, and well system were markedly more substantial than anticipated, and will require significant funds. The land itself is also in deep need of tending and stewardship, which will involve a great deal of on-going labor and financial support.

Phase 2 objectives also aim to establish an operating endowment to ensure the long-term success of this rematriation effort and the safety and stability of the Nevada City Rancheria Nisenan Tribe. Beyond establishing stable housing for Tribal Elders, CHIRP and the Tribe's long-term vision for Yulića involves environmental healing, community education and collaboration, and cultural revitalization and preservation.

Zoom-only Participants: The suggested contribution is \$25.

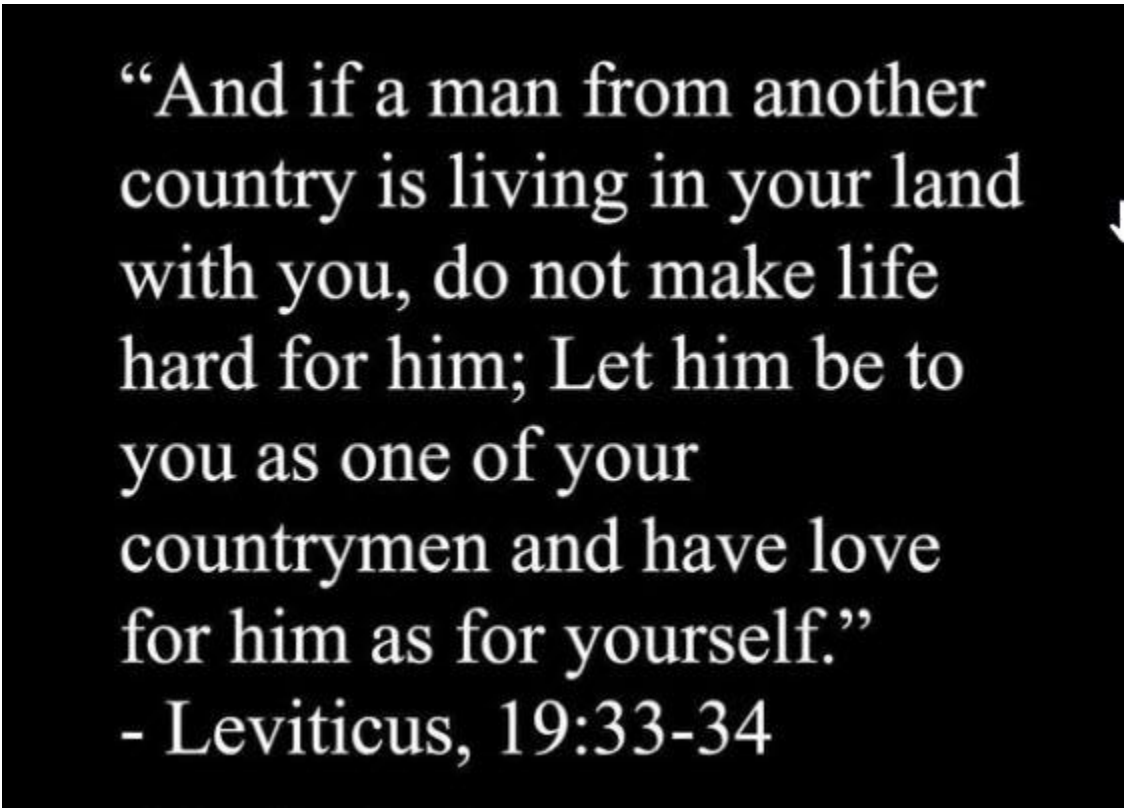
Estimated Cost per person to CPQM for Lodging and Facility use: *Adults age 16+* \$140 per person
Youth 5-15 years old \$70 per person

Facility charges: Camping \$35 per person per night. Staying off site at night and attending during daytime \$15 per person per day

Cost per person per meal: *Adults 16+* \$14.50//*Youth age 5-15* \$7.25

[Note: Thus an adult paying the actual facility cost of \$140 plus the actual cost of \$87 for 6 meals at \$14.50 would pay a total of \$227 for the week-end. The facility cost for a camper would be \$70 for the week-end plus \$87 for all 6 meals or a total of \$157 per person.]

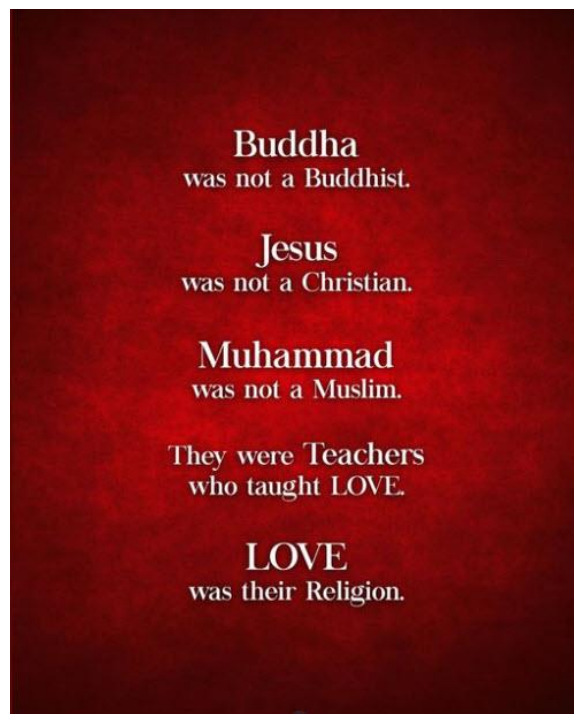

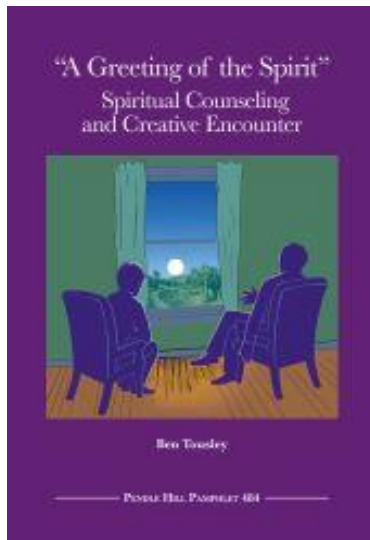

“A Greeting of the Spirit”: Spiritual Counseling and Creative Encounter PHP 484 By Ben Tousley

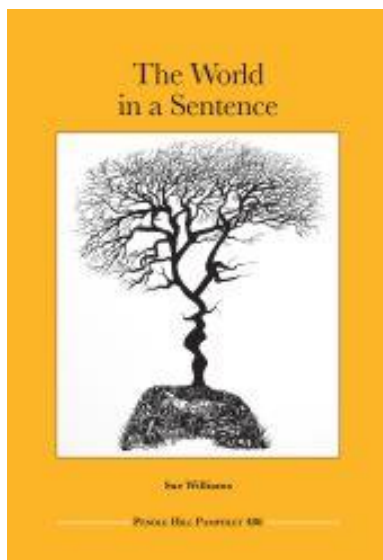
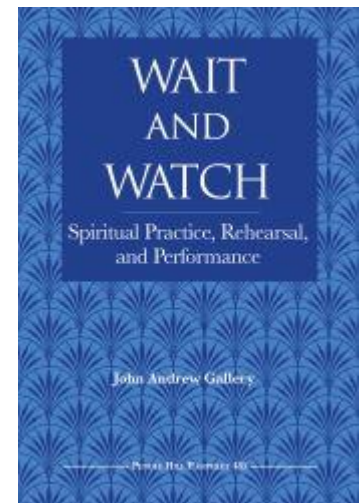
Synopsis
