

In daily relationships with others, both inside and outside the home, our lives as Friends speak immediately and lastingly. In these relationships, our faith may also be severely tested. We are called to respond to that of God in everyone: we are all children of God. Friends celebrate any union that is dedicated to mutual love and respect, regardless of the unique make-up of the family. We strive to create homes where the Spirit of the Divine resides at the center and where the individual genius of each member is respected and nurtured.


Human sexuality is a divine gift, forming part of the complex union of body, mind and spirit that is our humanity. In a loving adult relationship in a context of mutual responsibility, sexuality brings delight, fulfillment and celebration.

The presence of children carries a special blessing as well as responsibility. Children bring unique spiritual gifts — wonder, resiliency, playfulness and more. Recognize and honor the Divine Light within children and treat them with the dignity and respect that is due to all people. Listen to and learn from children; share with them those values and practices that are central to our own lives. Special care must be given to resolving problems

between adults and children in a manner that gives equal weight to the feelings and needs of both children and adults. Tender parenting is one of the critically important peace vocations in our society. Make every effort to offer all parents the personal and institutional support that this challenging work requires.

Take a strong stand against any form of abuse, whether that abuse is minor or severe, and whether it is emotional, physical or sexual in nature. The terrible impact of abuse on the most vulnerable members of our families creates lifelong suffering for its victims and is a major source of violence in our society. Perpetrators are themselves usually victims of similar violence and should be approached with compassion as well as firmness.

- Do I make my home a place of friendliness, joy, and peace, where residents and visitors feel God's presence?
- Are my sexual practices consistent with my spiritual beliefs and free of manipulation and exploitation?
- What barriers keep me from responding openly and lovingly to each person?
- Do we open our thoughts, beliefs, and deep understandings to our children and others who share our lives and our hospitality?
- Do we provide our children and young adults with a framework for active, ongoing participation in the Meeting?

ANNUAL APPEAL, 2025

Dear Friends.

Throughout 2025, Grass Valley Friends Meeting (GVFM) has deepened in spiritual strength valued in these changing times. Though we are a small meeting, we hold decision-making and the creation of a beloved community important and worthwhile. You can come to meeting when you are experiencing hardship and don't feel whole. You can come here and be held. Our beloved community feels alive and well, providing a rest for the sabbath.

You are a part of this community. You are always welcomed. You are a part of our efforts to keep you up to date when circumstances may keep you from attending Meeting for Worship. It is especially important now that our Meeting's spiritual strength is available to all who need support.

The sale of what had been Sierra Friends Center to California Heritage Indigenous Research Project (CHIRP) after 60 years of Quaker stewardship, presented existential questions for our Meeting. Would we be able to stay or would we go? We greeted these changes with discernment and sensitivity, appreciating the historic significance of the return of the land to its original inhabitants. John Woolamn School became Yulica, a Nisenan village. Our Meeting has been able to remain in the Woolman Lane Meeting House. We are glad for the acceptance extended to us by the Nisenan.

Financial contributions to our Meeting throughout fiscal 2024 -2025, have made it possible for Meeting to increase donations to the following organizations:

There is also increased funding available for scholarships to Pacific Yearly and College Park Quarterly meetings and Friends General Conference. This increased capacity serves to strengthen GVFM's presence in our local communities and within the wider Quaker society.

For many years, the idea of moving our meeting to town has been, from time to time, a topic of consideration. It would make us more visible and easier to find. With the sale of the land, our ability to hold weddings, memorials and more public presentations has come into question, and so we have begun a search for possible sites in town that would serve our needs and, importantly, be affordable. 2025 has been a year that has made it possible for us to consider where we hold Meeting for Worship and our other activities and, if we had a different location, would that make it easier for you to join us.

Peace Lutheran Church has extended an offer for us to consider renting some of their classrooms and Meeting has agreed to explore this. We will be holding a trial Meeting for Worship there on Sunday November 2. Further details have been emailed to all. You are invited to be a part of this experiment. We hope this move, if adopted, wil contribute to your ability to join us for Meeting for Worship and have your young people participate in First

Day School, a program that is well thought out and staffed by qualified and caring members of Meeting. Stay tuned!

As 2025 comes to an end, there is promise of interesting opportunities and, of course, challenges in 2026. On October 9, 2025, FCNL hosted a webinar, <u>Faithful Advocacy During a Crisis</u>, included timely updates, powerful speakers, and opportunities for action.

- Representative Jason Crow (CO-06) thanked FCNL advocates for your persistent efforts towards a more
 peaceful world—and challenged us to keep pushing Congress to assert its authority over matters of war
 and peace.
- Three faithful advocates left me inspired and energized during this difficult time, reminding us about the power of putting your faith into action.
- FCNL's director for foreign policy, Heather Brandon-Smith, shared breaking news of the Senate voting to repeal the 2002 and 1991 Authorizations for the Use of Military Force.

Here are the actions and resources we discussed:

- 1. Bookmark and share FCNL's new <u>Weekly Witness action page</u>, a one-stop-shop to empower you to take meaningful action in the ways that are best for you.
- 2. Urge your members of Congress to <u>reopen the government, protect health care, and defend Congress's power of the purse</u>.
- 3. Attend an upcoming training, <u>Intro to Advocacy</u>.
- 4. Join or start an Advocacy Team near you!
- 5. Become a monthly donor to FCNL and help empower our collective advocacy.

I'm so grateful to you and the entire FCNL community of advocates. This is hard work, especially right now. Regardless of how you make your voice heard, redouble your efforts and invite others to join you—and invite them to join FCNL's efforts, too!



After two horrific years of bombardment and blockade, we welcome <u>news</u> of a possible reprieve from the violence and genocide in Gaza and a return of all hostages. Any pause that spares lives is an opportunity to begin the long and difficult work of healing and rebuilding lives.

A lasting peace will require real guarantees, justice and accountability, an end to the occupation, the restoration of robust humanitarian aid, and long-term peacebuilding. Fragile ceasefires have broken down in the past, including, most recently, Israel's <u>violation</u> of its ceasefire agreement in Lebanon. We urge all parties to the agreement, including the United States government, to turn the world's hopes for peace in Palestine and Israel into reality. **READ MORE.**

Awakening the Witness: Convincement and Belonging in Quaker Community

In many Quaker communities, there are ongoing conversations about what it means to belong. These are often rooted in anxieties about the future of Friends as numbers fall, younger Friends move around, and new forms of Quaker community appear online. In this pamphlet Matt Rosen reminds us that an experience of God's guiding and transforming power, which draws us together – what early Quakers called convincement – is as important as membership. He discusses his experience of convincement, what it meant for early Friends to belong, and how anxieties about the future of Friends can be lessened by recognizing that the living Christ is greater than any institution. Discussion questions included.

In worship we have our neighbors to right and left, before and behind, yet the Eternal Presence is over all and beneath all.

Worship does not consist in achieving a mental state of concentrated isolation from one's fellows. But in depth of common worship it is as if we found our separate lives were all one life, within whom we live and move and have our being.
