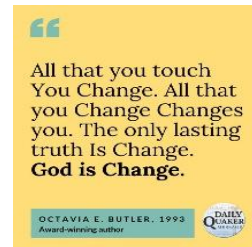

## **QUARTERLY TREASURER’S REPORT**

Summary = Still going well!

This report covers our 2nd 2025-2026 fiscal quarter: January 1, 2026 – March 31, 2026. The contributions of \$3,990 were welcome and greatly appreciated. Our 2nd quarter expenses (\$1,795) were within our budget. This included our monthly expenses of rent and internet (\$124 less than our previous location), newsletter cost, etc., and our annual CPQM dues of \$130.

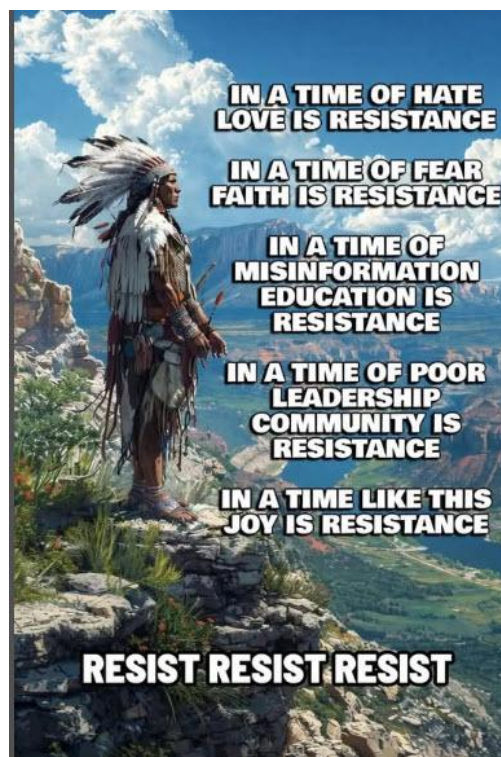
## UNPRECEDENTED INCREASE – AI Report

Reports indicate an unprecedented 1,000% increase in inquiries regarding conscientious objector (CO) status among U.S. military personnel, driven by objections to the conflict with Iran. Advocacy groups, including the Center on Conscience & War, report a surge in requests for assistance, with some organizations reporting call volumes three to four times higher than normal.

Key details regarding this trend:

- **Surge Timing:** The spike in interest followed the commencement of military action against Iran in early 2026.
- **Increased Inquiries:** Organizations such as the GI Rights Hotline and Quaker House reported significantly higher call volumes in March 2026.
- **Concerns Mentioned:** Many callers referenced ethical concerns regarding the conflict, with some specifically citing the casualties from the US bombing of a girls' school in Minab.
- **High-Risk Units:** Reports suggest that some of these filings are coming from units facing immediate deployment.

*Note: The 1,000% figure represents an increase in inquiries for advice and legal assistance, rather than a confirmed 1,000% rise in formal, approved applications processed by the military.*
